- Demonstrate an affirming attitude toward the school, a willingness to accept positive criticism, a professional demeanor and integrity
- Encompass a positive discipline approach in guiding student behavior
- Develop learning experiences that meet the students' varying needs and interests
- Report immediately major student misbehavior to the appropriate division director
- Maintain high standards of respect, courtesy, and mutual consideration with the school community, including with students, staff, and parents
- Serve on faculty committees as needed
- Communicate in a positive, supportive, timely and professional manner with parents (written and verbal) on an ongoing basis
- Attend faculty and division meetings including required meetings/events before the beginning of, during and after the conclusion of the school year
- Demonstrate openness to observations, feedback, and coaching on classroom instruction
- Participation in the CAIS outdoor education program as needed
- Administrative and supervisory duties outside of class as assigned by the middle school director

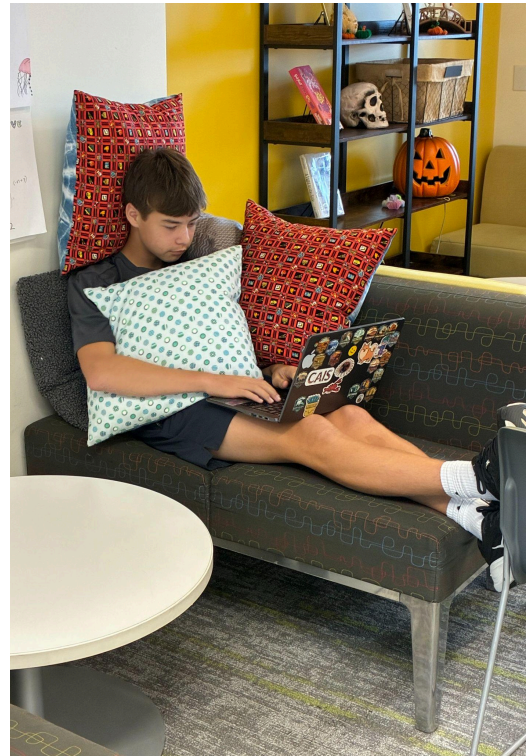
